

## Want To Get Rid Of That "\$audit-bad layer" Error ?

We have gotten a few support calls regarding auditing and purging and how that audit/purge process can sometimes produce a layer entitled, \$AUDIT-BAD-LAYER, which cannot be purged.

Doing an audit brings up the bad layer. Purging will remove the bad layer; however a subsequent audit will then reproduce it.

The question we get is how do you permanently purge this layer from the drawing?

I've had success with the following steps (which was actually extracted from a discussion group thread:

1. AUDIT the drawing
2. PURGE the drawing to get rid of \$audit\_bad\_layer
3. SAVE the drawing
4. QUIT the drawing
5. OPEN the drawing
6. AUDIT and PURGE again, and you will see the \$AUDIT-BAD-LAYER will be GONE!
